

Using Two Verbs

When you use two verbs together, conjugate the first verb, but don't conjugate the second one.

Necesitar:	Necesitas comprar un libro.	You need to buy a book.
Desear:	Deseo escuchar la musica.	I want to listen to the music.
Esperar:	Esperamos ganar.	We hope to win.
Practicar:	Él practica cantar.	He practices singing.
Terminar:	Ella termina practicar.	She finishes practicing.

Tener + Another Verb

When you use tener with another verb (I have to _____), add "que" after tener.

Yo tengo que practicar.	I have to practice.
Ella tiene que trabajar.	She has to work.
Nosotros tenemos que esperar.	We have to wait.

Ir + Another Verb

When you use ir with another verb (I am going to _____), add "a" after ir.

Yo voy a estudiar.	I'm going to study.
Tú vas a tocar la guitarra.	You are going to play the guitar.
¡Vamos a ganar!	We are going to win!

Gustar

When you like something, you use the word gustar.

Gustar means "to give pleasure".

"Me gusta el libro" literally means "The book gives me pleasure." (We say, "I like the book.")

Me gusta cantar.	I like to sing.
Te gusta cantar.	You like to sing.
Le gusta cantar.	He likes to sing. She likes to sing. Usted likes to sing.
Nos gusta cantar.	We like to sing.
Les gusta cantar.	Y'all like to sing. They like to sing.
